
SEASPIRACY (2021)


AN INCONVENIENT TRUTH (2006)

Following its release, An Inconvenient Truth sparked a global conversation about climate change. The film's compelling presentation of scientific data and personal anecdotes from former Vice President AI Gore significantly increased public awareness about the urgency of the climate crisis. This awareness translated into action, leading to policy discussions at various levels of government and inspiring grassroots movements worldwide. The documentary won two Academy Awards and played a pivotal role in bringing climate change into mainstream discourse, encouraging individuals and organizations to advocate for sustainable practices and policies.

BLACKFISH (2013)

"Blackfish" exposed the harsh reality of orcas in captivity, sparking widespread public outrage and prompting SeaWorld to make significant policy changes, including ending its orca breeding program and theatrical shows. This documentary's impact reached far beyond the marine park industry, igniting global discussions about animal welfare and ethical standards in wildlife attractions. It exemplifies cinema's power to drive social change and advocate for greater compassion towards animals.
